ABOUT THE EXHIBIT

The Survivor Quilts & Photography exhibit features twelve collaborative handcrafted quilt designs and seventeen framed youth photography and writing pairings provided by Turning Point of Macomb County and presented by the Anton Art Center.

The works in this exhibit are made using art therapy to aid both youth and adult survivors in their individual healing process and to help raise awareness. Art is an expressive medium that can be used as an outlet for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault to communicate, overcome stress, and sort through feelings and thoughts about trauma.

Each quilt is made using cloth swatches that were provided to survivors over the years to share personal messages at various stages of healing, ranging in levels of anger, depression, and forgiveness. Each color swatch has a particular significance: yellow for survivor of sexual violence, red for survivor of child sexual assault, purple for survivor of sexual assault as a hate crime, and blue for a significant other.
