### ANTON ART CENTER TO HOST THE GOVERNOR'S TOP 30 TRAVELING STUDENT ART SHOW THIS SUMMER

Presented by the Michigan Art Education Association, the *Governor's Top 30 Traveling Student Show* showcases thirty selected artworks produced by high school art students from across the state of Michigan.

Nearly five hundred works are submitted annually and are adjudicated in a series of regional and state level exhibits down to a group of one hundred artworks. These pieces are featured in the Visual Art Exhibit at the Michigan Youth Arts Festival held each spring at Western Michigan Universality in Kalamazoo.

Of the one hundred finalists, jurors choose thirty of the most outstanding works to produce the traveling collection. This show tours several different venues across the state for a year, until finally going on display in the Governor's Executive Office in the state capitol in Lansing.

"Getting student work into any show is great," says Fraser High School art teacher, Roger Drabant, "having students represented in this show has the added bonus of having their work seen not only locally, but by a much larger audience across the state." Two Fraser students have artwork in the show.

This year's collection includes artworks from counties across the Lower Peninsula, including Lenawee, Hillsdale, St. Joseph, Macomb, Oakland, Livingston, Ottawa, Mason, Newaygo, Washtenaw, St. Clair, Clinton, Kent, Lapeer, and Saginaw.

Lake Orion High School also has two students in the show. Art teacher, Melissa Wilson, says this exhibit "highlights the positive role the arts play in Michigan high schools. Art has the ability to make people see different viewpoints and brings understanding to issues we all face," and that "much of the work [in this exhibit] deals with social justice issues and creative problem-solving."

Saginaw Arts and Sciences Academy 10<sup>th</sup> grader, Bella Campbell, describes her figure drawing featured in the show, "I wanted to produce the likeness of my friends, Precious and Grace...I love that their names reflect their personalities that I hoped to capture in my rendering."

The exhibit is open Saturday, July 13<sup>th</sup> through Tuesday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, in the Anton Art Center's Petitpren Community Gallery located on the second floor. A free public reception will be held on Saturday, July 13th from 2-4pm with light refreshments provided. Admission is always free, and metered parking is free on the weekends. Additionally, a unique complement to the student show will be open on the first floor: the first ever *Macomb County Art Teacher Show* will be open from June 22<sup>nd</sup> through August 13<sup>th</sup>, featuring 52 selected artwork by 32 teaching artists who live and/or work as a visual arts instructor of any media in the county, either presently or retired. In fact, several students included in the *Top 30* exhibit will see a few familiar instructors in the *Teacher Show*.
